Background

Since 1972, Division TEACCH has coordinated the largest statewide, public school-based educational program for children with autism and related disorders. In 1995, the Watson Institute began working with Division TEACCH staff to offer training seminars for professionals in the Pittsburgh region.

The Watson Institute provides individualized programming for children diagnosed with autism, cerebral palsy, muscular dystrophy, neurological impairments, developmental delays, brain injuries, severe emotional and behavioral challenges, and other impairments. Watson also provides consultation, training and program development services for individuals, schools and other educational organizations to enhance the skills of those who work with children with disabilities.
