Sean Barron is a co-author of *There's a Boy in Here: Emerging from the Bonds of Autism and The Unwritten Rules of Social Relationships: Decoding Social Mysteries Through the Unique Perspectives of Autism*. Sean is a distinguished speaker on "his release of the terrifying imprisonment of his own mind" as a child with autism to become a successful journalist and writer.

Lindsay Wagner, Psy.D. is a post doctoral fellow at The Watson Institute specializing in pediatric neuropsychology. She completes diagnostic and neuropsychological evaluations, provides supervision on home based therapy services, provides training for students in the internship program and consultation to the Watson Institute Summer Program (WISP).

Lisa Nippoldt-Baca, Psy.D. is a pediatric neuropsychology post doctoral fellow at The Watson Institute. She completes full neuropsychological assessments along with diagnostic and wrap-around evaluations. She is also involved in supervising and carrying out therapy and consultation in Watson's neurological Wraparound program.

Sharon Smith, M.Ed. works as both an Educational Consultant and a Team Coordinator at The Watson Institute. As a consultant she provides training and support to districts in a variety of areas including positive behavior support, adapting curriculum, developing effective classroom environments, teamwork and supporting students with autism.

She has worked with children and adults with autism for over 25 years.
