Camp WISP (Watson Inclusive Summer Program) is an inclusive summer camp designed for children with Autism Spectrum Disorder and other special needs to support the development of social skills through interactions with their typically-developing peers.

Parents, school personnel and community service providers collaborate in developing detailed goals and objectives for each child's summer program. Specially trained staff provide individualized programming for each child, teaching social interactions, communication skills, coping skills, problem solving skills and behavioral competencies through facilitated participation in age-appropriate activities.
